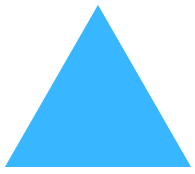
## Grammar Symbols Three Part Cards

Level 0

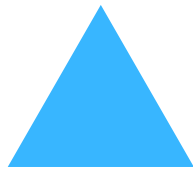
This set includes 3 part cards (picture with label, label, picture) of each grammar symbol along with its definition card.

2. Cut the cards along the border and ask the child to match the label with the correct symbol.

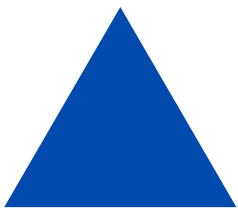

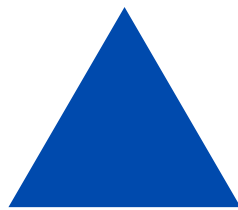


Article

Article is used to signal the presence of a noun. It is any of the following three words: **A**, **An** and **The**

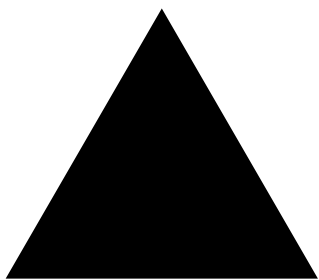


Adjective

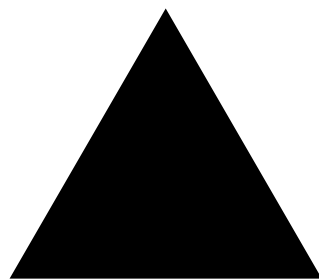


Adjective

The adjective is a word that modifies (describes) a noun.  
For example big, red, beautiful, etc

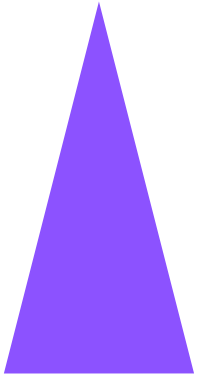


Noun

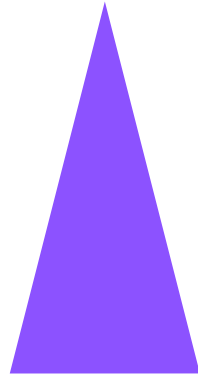


Noun

The noun is the word that names person, place, thing, quality, or act.  
For example book, girl, country, etc



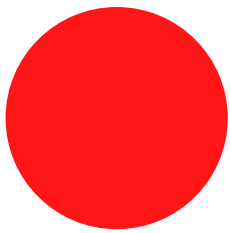
Pronoun



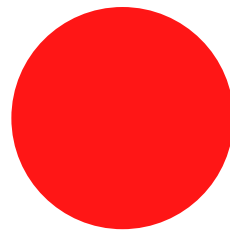
Pronoun

A pronoun is a word that substitutes a noun

For example he, she, it, they, you, me, etc



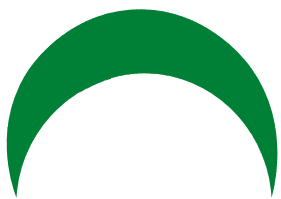
Verb



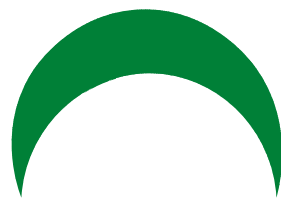
Verb

The verb is a word that describes action, existence, or occurrence.

For example eats, sing, stopped, etc



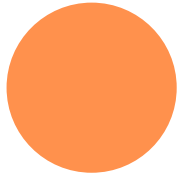
Preposition



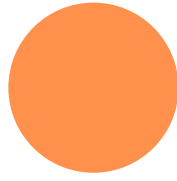
Preposition

The preposition is the word that shows the relationship between a noun to a verb, adjective, or noun

For example: to, from, for, into etc



Adverb



Adverb

The adverb is a word that modifies (describes) a verb, an adjective, or another adverb

For example slowly, sadly etc



Conjunction



Conjunction

The conjunction is a word that joins other words, phrases, or sentences

For example and, as well as, either-or, etc



Interjection



Interjection

The interjection is a word, phrase, or sound used as an exclamation and capable of standing itself.

For example Hurray!  
Aww!, Phew
