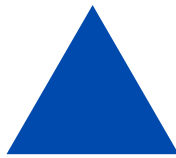
Level 7: Identify articles, nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns and conjunctions in a sentence

Conjunction: is the word that joins other words, phrases, or sentences. For example, and, or, but, yet, either, etc.

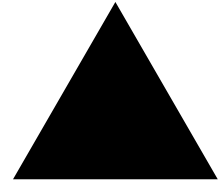

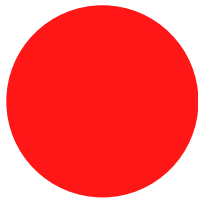

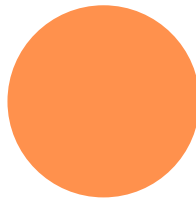

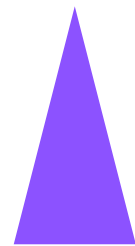
